

SUMMER PROGRAMS FOR THE SEASON 2019

<u>OPEN HOUSE</u> – May 19th, 1-4pm. Theme: Local Art—Past and Present. Come visit the many activities planned to showcase local history including a new exhibit featuring the Village of Cayuga. These activities will help raise funds to replace the roof over the exhibit areas. Activities planned: Art displays by local students, art demonstrations, scavenger hunt for all ages, raffle of a Frontenac Island painting, snacks, Treleaven wine tasting, and so much more!

June 9th – 7pm. The Sullivan Trail, presented by Mike Groth, Professor of History at Wells College. Exploring the strategic significance of upstate New York and the campaign to destroy Native American settlements during the War for Independence.

July 14th – 7pm. The Civilian Conservation Corps, presented by Josh Teeter, Environmental Educator, Finger Lakes Region, NYS Parks. The Finger Lakes region, like much of the United States, benefitted from Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal legislation. Learn about the conditions that led to the creation of the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) in 1933, what life was like for its members and the enduring work which still surrounds us today.

August 18th – 6:15pm. Annual Meeting at the Museum with hors d'oeuvres and beverages provided. 7pm. Rumrunners, Bootleggers and Speakeasies on Lake Ontario presented by John Lamphere, Professor of History at CCC. The focus is on Fair Haven, Sterling and Oswego during Prohibition.

September 8th – 7pm. Montezuma National Wildlife Refuge, a 10,000 acre preserve ,is a stopping point for migratory birds. President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed an Executive order establishing the bird refuge on September 12, 1938. It became a national monument in 1973.

The shingles on the exhibit part of the Museum date to the 1960's. To continue the preservation of our exhibits and artifacts, the contractor's assessment was to replace as soon as possible. Under the leadership of Marilyn Baader and Pat Kimber, with support from the Board of Directors, a goal of \$20,000 was established. As of this newsletter, we are well on our way! Cayuga Lake National Bank helped lead the way with a \$5,000 matching grant.
